



## PART IV - TEST BASIS

- 20% Anatomy & Physiology
- 10% Organizational Behaviour (Chart, Table, Oil)
- 20% Contraindications (must have at least 70% on contraindications or 14/20)
- 10% Massage Therapy Techniques
- 40% Treatments (includes assessment)

**- Must achieve a total grade of 70% or better**

## PART V – PLEASE NOTE

Candidates for the oral/practical exam may choose to be examined in either English or French, the official languages of New Brunswick.

A) The cost of the oral/practical exam is \$225.00 (***\$195.00 for new graduates***). A certified cheque or a money order must be sent to NBMA one week prior to the exam. In the absence of time, payment may be made to the examiners immediately prior to the exam.

B) During the year 2009, NBMA will conduct examinations for new candidates on July 3, 4, & 5 September 4, 5, & 6 and, Dec 4, 5 & 6 (tentative dates only). Please note additional requests received outside these dates will also be accommodated. Candidates are advised to complete their application files as soon as possible and forward to the Registrar. Once a candidate's file is received, it may be referred to the Standards and Examinations Committee for review. The candidate will then be notified by the Registrar of the date, time and place of his/her examination.

C) If a candidate is unsuccessful at the time of the 1<sup>st</sup> examination he/she will be informed in writing after the exam of further requirements prior to being permitted to take a 2<sup>nd</sup> examination. The minimum time interval between exams is 30 days. The cost of this rewrite is \$225.00 (***\$195.00 for new graduates***).

D) If a candidate is unsuccessful at the time of the 2<sup>nd</sup> examination, he/she will be informed in writing after the exam of further requirements prior to being permitted to take a 3<sup>rd</sup> examination. The minimum time interval between exams is 30 days. The cost of this rewrite is \$225.00 (***\$195.00 for new graduates***).

E) If a candidate is unsuccessful at the time of the 3<sup>rd</sup> examination there will be no further attempts permitted until a full course (2200 hours) has been completed.
